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# **INSTRUCTIONAL STRATEGIES**

The course is structured in two stages:

STAGE 1: During the period weekly lectures will be held, alternated with practical workshops to apply knowledge. Parallel will be assigned exercises of 15 days duration, employing a previous selected software.

STAGE 2: Strengthened of provided knowledge by lectures, its classes discussion and practical workshops; a final work is elaborated incorporating all the exercised technics. These work will be revised during the two last weeks and presented as a design portfolio.
